### [Celebrating the Life of Pauline Maier at MIT](#)

The history faculty at Massachusetts Institute of Technology will host a memorial service for Pauline R. Maier, William R. Kenan Jr. Professor of American History (1938-2013). Professor Maier received her Ph.D. from Harvard in 1968 and was an acclaimed scholar of early American history. Her book publications include *From Resistance to Revolution: Colonial Radicals and the Development of American Opposition to Britain, 1765-1776* (1972), *The Old Revolutionaries: Political Lives in the Age of Samuel Adams* (1980), and *The American People: A History* (1986).

The service will be held at 4pm on Tuesday, October 29th in Kresge Auditorium of Building W16 at MIT. Colleagues, students, and friends of the Maier family are invited to attend.
