

BCC History Department & Holocaust Center Hosts Crimes Against Humanity: A Conference on Native American Genocide

Fall River, MA - Today the Bristol Community College's History Department and Holocaust Center announce that both organizations will be hosting a conference entitled Crimes Against Humanity: A Conference of Native American Genocide. It will be held on Friday, March 31st, 2017, beginning at 8:30AM and ending at 3PM, at the Jackson Art Center Auditorium. The campus address is 777 Elsbree Street, Fall River, MA 02720.

Coffee and pastries will be provided to begin, and the keynote address will be given by Columbia University Professor Dr. Karl Jacoby. This will be followed by *Native American Voices on Genocide: A Discussion Panel*, moderated by Newport Historical Society's Visiting Curator of Native American History, Michael J. Simpson.
